Councilmember Trayon White introduced the following bill which was \_\_\_\_\_.

To amend Section 16-801 of the District of Columbia Official Code to expand the definition of an eligible felony and to make all misdemeanors eligible for sealing.

BE IT ENACTED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Criminal Record Expungement Amendment Act of 2017"

Sec. 2 Section 16-801C of the District of Columbia Code is amended to read as follows:

"(6) "Eligible Felony" means:

"(A) Failure to appear (§ 23-1327);

"(B) Theft (§ 2232-12); and

"(C) Felony possession (§ 48-904.01).

(b) Strike (9) in its entirety.

(c) Section 16-803(c) is amended as follows:

1                   (1) Paragraph (1) is amended by striking the phrase “8” and inserting the phrase  
2                   “3” in its place.

3                   **Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement**

4                   The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal  
5 impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975,  
6 approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

7                   **Sec. 4. Effective date.**

8                   The act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by6 the  
9 Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as  
10 provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December  
11 24, 1973, (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of  
12 Columbia Register.
